## WHERE ?

**The Thoraxklinik, Heidelberg** is one of the oldest and largest lung specialist clinics in Europe, with more than 100 years of history in pulmonary care. The clinic is part of the University Hospital Heidelberg, treating patients with diseases of the lung, the mediastinum, the pleura and the chest wall. The focus of recent scientific research at the Thoraxklinik has been the advancement of interdisciplinary diagnosis and therapy for all forms of pulmonary diseases, especially interstitial lung diseases (ILDs). A further focus of the Department of Pneumology is interventional endoscopy, e.g. in the treatment of lung emphysema or new innovative tools in diagnosing ILDs. The Translational Research section also maintains one of the largest biobanks of lung tissues in the world.

## WHO ?

**Michael Kreuter** is Professor of Internal Medicine at the Ruprecht-Karls-University, Heidelberg, Germany and Head of the Center for interstitial and rare lung diseases at the Thoraxklinik, University Hospital Heidelberg. His clinical and scientific interest focuses on interstitial and orphan lung diseases, within the German Center for Lung Research. Current research projects are exploring epidemiologic questions as well as the role of comorbidities, biomarkers and the diagnosis of interstitial and other orphan lung diseases.

**Felix Lasitschka** is Head of the Division of Thoracic Pathology at the Institute for Pathology, University Hospital Heidelberg, Germany. His research interests include neoplasms, infectious diseases and interstitial lung diseases.

**Claus Peter Heußel** is Head of the Department of Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology of the Thoraxklinik. He is also a Professor for Radiology at the Ruprecht-Karls-University, Heidelberg, Germany and member of the German Center for Lung Research. His research focuses on thoracic imaging with a special interest in interstitial lung diseases.

**Nelleke C.Tak-van Jaarsveld** is ILD-Nurse at the Department of Respiratory Medicine, Erasmus Medical Center, University Hospital Rotterdam, The Netherlands.
